

# **Project Review Information**



### Stage 1 - 2019 Lucindale Township Masterplan

Through a team of external consultants, various forms of engagement and consultation were undertaken over 2 phases to deliver the 2019 Lucindale Township Masterplan for the community. This included community meetings and workshops, drop-in sessions, Elected Member and staff workshops and community surveys and reviews of the draft Masterplan.

# Stage 2 - 2022 Musgrave Avenue Detail Design

Council commenced Stage 2 consultation to seek additional feedback on the Musgrave Avenue concept plans outlined in the Lucindale Township Masterplan so Council could proceed to detail design for this project.

A 2-phased consultation program was endorsed by Council and a community survey was delivered between November and December 2022. Community feedback through this process and a subsequent Council resolution directed Council administration not to proceed with Phase 2 of this consultation program or proceed with detail design work for Musgrave Avenue.

### Stage 3 - 2023 Musgrave Avenue Project Review

Council administration have reviewed the Stage 2 survey feedback from the community, as some alternative or new projects were suggested.

To put these ideas into a manageable process to assist decision making for the Council, a matrix has been developed that outlines a summary of the community suggestions, cross-referenced back against:

- Operational and/or asset management/replacement projects which are addressed as a matter of course in annual budgets
- Projects which need to be pursued with the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT)
- Projects which need to be driven by local businesses
- Projects which fall outside the scope of the consultation
- Projects which meet the scope of the consultation

### Where to now?

As identified through the matrix, most ideas from the community form part of the annual operational or asset/maintenance renewal program or are not the responsibility of Council. Some ideas involving minor modifications to Musgrave Avenue/Gum Avenue were suggested however a majority of the feedback from the survey was to leave the intersection as it is. Other ideas put forward are outside the scope of this project and budget or considered projects that would be driven by businesses in the Musgrave Avenue precinct.

As a result, only a small number of projects put forward by the community are within the scope of the Musgrave Avenue project.

In summary these projects include:

- New flower beds
- Recycling bins
- More bench seating
- Art work to improve the streetscape
- Public mural

Based on the community feedback and the change of focus for the Musgrave Avenue project, Council now invites interested community members to attend a Community Walkaround evening at Musgrave Avenue.

This will be an opportunity for the community to ask questions and provide further feedback on the survey comments and new ideas put forward.

The feedback gathered from this Community Walkaround will be presented in a report at the March Council Meeting.
