BIN COLLECTIONS

HOW TO USE THE KERBSIDE COLLECTION SYSTEM

- There should only ever be a maximum of two (2) bins out on any given collection day, general waste bin and either yellow recycling bin or green organics bin (see calendar).
- Put the bins out by 7.00am on the day of pick up and bring them back in within 24 hours of pick up.
- Bins are required to be one (1) metre apart where possible and one (1) metre from surrounding objects (such as poles, trees, cars, etc.) with plenty of clearance from overhead branches.
- Don't put the bins behind parked cars.
- Place the right material in the right bin.
- Ensure your bin is not packed too tightly and the bin lid is closed.

BINS MAY NOT BE COLLECTED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS

- Excessively contaminated with materials that should not be placed in that bin.
- Excessive weight – bins that exceed 70 kgs in weight will not be collected.

BIN CONTAMINANTS

Spot audits may be conducted on bins presented at the kerbside for collection.

Bins containing contaminants will not be emptied. A sticker placed on the bin will inform residents that the contaminants must be removed from the bin before the next collection.

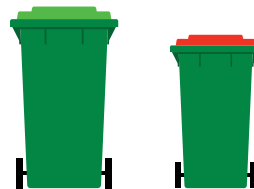
Households who continue to present their bins with contamination will be suspended from the kerbside waste collection service for 3 months.

If residents find they have a sticker on their bin they are encouraged to refer to their Kerbside Collection Calendar to determine the offending material.

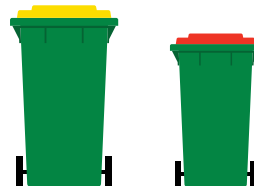
ORGANICS BIN WEEK

HOW TO USE YOUR WASTE BIN CORRECTLY

You can reduce what goes into your waste bin by doing the following:

AVOID waste in the first place

- Refuse junk mail if you don't want to read it
- Share magazines and newspapers or access them online

REDUCE what you throw away

- Set up a compost bin and worm farm
- Buy in bulk and products with minimal packaging
- Repair before replacing

REUSE materials in an innovative way

- Buy items in refillable containers
- Reuse containers for storing food, pens, buttons, screws etc

RECYCLE products to save natural resources

- Close the loop and buy recycled products
- Use your recycling bin or your local recycling depot.



WASTE

Your waste bin is the smaller 140 litre bin with the red lid. Please check the bin collections section for your collection day.

Collected: weekly



WHAT GOES IN THE WASTE BIN?

- Any remaining items that cannot be recycled or composted
- Plastic bags, garbage bags, non-recyclable plastic and food packaging (e.g. chip packets)
- Crockery, broken glass, mirrors, etc
- Polystyrene, foam, cling film
- Nappies
- Ropes and hoses



WHAT DOES NOT GO IN THE WASTE BIN?

- All liquid waste, building and construction waste (including rocks and earth)
- Hot ashes, hazardous or radioactive materials
- Flares, ammunition or explosives
- Medical waste
- Automobile parts or
- Gas cylinders.

WHAT CAN I PUT IN MY RECYCLING BIN?



RECYCLING - IF IN DOUBT, PLACE IN RED BIN

Your recycling bin is the 240 litre bin with the yellow lid. Please check the bin collections section for your collection day.

Collected: fortnightly on the days in yellow on the calendar



WHAT GOES IN THE RECYCLING BIN?

- Steel and aluminium cans (including aerosols)
- All glass bottles and jars (rinsed and with lids off)
- Paper and cardboard (newspapers, magazines, envelopes, junk mail, egg cartons, cardboard boxes – flattened)
- Liquid paperboard cartons (e.g. juice & milk cartons – rinsed)
- Clean plant pots and seedling tubs
- All rigid plastic containers (e.g. plastic drink bottles, detergent bottles, yoghurt, icecream and margarine containers – rinsed and lids off)



DO NOT

- Do not bundle newspaper or cardboard
- Do not put your recycling in plastic bags
- Do not mix recyclables eg putting cans in boxes
- No polystyrene

RECYCLING TIPS

- Hard, rigid plastic lids can be collected in a plastic bottle (such as a milk bottle) and placed in the recycling bin with the lid off.
- If you can scrunch a piece of plastic packaging in your hand it can not be recycled and needs to be put into your red lidded bin.
- Remove all lids from jars, bottles and plastic containers before putting them in the bin.
- Rinse containers as necessary - save water, use leftover dishwater.
- Place all recyclables loose into the bin.

WHAT CAN I PUT IN MY GREEN ORGANICS BIN?



GREEN ORGANICS

Your green organics bin is the 240 litre bin with the green lid. Please check the bin collections section for your collection day.

Collected: fortnightly on the days in green on the calendar



ITEMS THAT CAN BE PLACED IN YOUR GREEN ORGANICS BIN INCLUDE

- Lawn clippings
- Small prunings and cuttings
- Bark, small branches and twigs
- Weeds
- Seaweed
- Cut flowers
- Leaves
- Sweepings
- Food scraps

ORGANIC BIN TIPS

- Remember, your garden waste is a valuable resource used to make mulch, so do the right thing.
- Do not put materials in plastic bags or use bin liners.
- If you don't have grass or garden clippings, line your bin with newspaper, it will prevent smelly residue buildup.

The Naracoorte Waste Transfer Station caters for various waste types including putrescible, green organics, recyclables, e-waste recycling (see section 7 for more information), hard waste, asbestos, steel and oil.

Naracoorte Lucindale Council participates in the drumMUSTER program that allows residents to collect and return empty and cleaned farm chemical containers to our transfer station for recycling. Contact Enviro Tec to make an appointment.

DID YOU KNOW? DRY PAINT DISPOSAL

Did you know that DRY paint is perfectly safe to dispose of in your waste bin?

You can harden paint at home by simply leaving the lid off or by adding a paint hardener purchased from a hardware store. Tap the hardened tablet of paint out of the tin and place in the waste bin. The empty, dry paint tins can be recycled in the yellow recycling bin.



Types of waste accepted at Council's Waste Transfer Station

ACCEPTED MATERIALS

- Organic material including lawn clippings, prunings and untreated timber
- Hard waste including furniture and domestic quantities of building waste, dirt, rocks and concrete.
- Scrap metal including lawn mowers, washing machines and paint tins
- E-waste including tvs, computers, microwaves, vacuums and kitchen appliances
- Jars, bottles and cans
- Cardboard and paper
- General waste
- **Empty chemical containers through drumMUSTER. Contact Enviro Tec on 8762 4719 for details (by appointment only).**
- Oil, steel, batteries - free



UNACCEPTED MATERIALS

- Gas bottles
- Tyres
- Car parts
- Household chemicals
- Hazardous waste
- Treated timber (creosote)



DID YOU KNOW? ASBESTOS DISPOSAL

- Must not be placed in any bin.
- Unlicensed persons can only remove less than 10m². Any area that is over this size must be done by a licenced person.
- Must be double wrapped in 200 micron plastic.
- Must be accompanied with a weigh docket.
- Must be in packs that can be lifted or on a pallet with a weight of no more than 400kg.

DRUM-MUSTER



drumMUSTER is the single biggest environmental program ever undertaken jointly by farmers/end chemical users, Local Government and the Crop Production and Animal Health Industries. The plastic and metal from *drumMUSTER* containers is all recycled into new products.

Naracoorte Lucindale Council participates in the *drumMUSTER* program that allows residents to return empty and cleaned farm chemical containers for recycling, please note:

- containers will be inspected on delivery before being accepted.
- containers with chemical residue cannot be accepted.
- only containers with a *drumMuster* logo will be accepted.

Empty and cleaned containers can be brought to Naracoorte Waste Transfer Station Monday to Friday by appointment with Enviro Tec. Appointments can be made through the office on (08) 8762 4719 during office hours.
